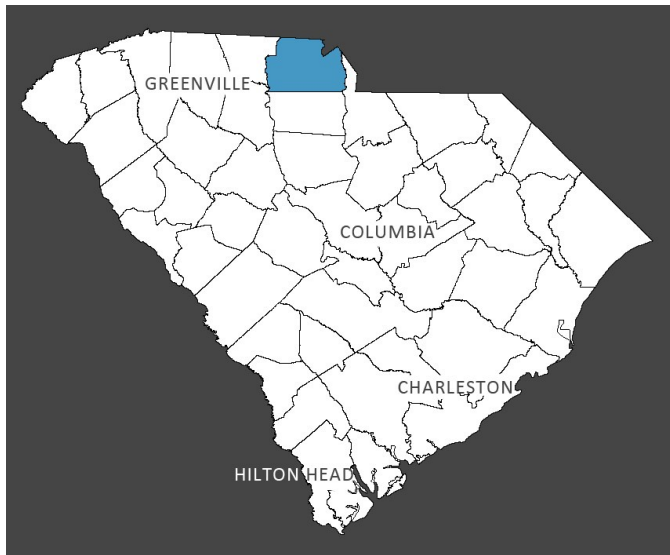

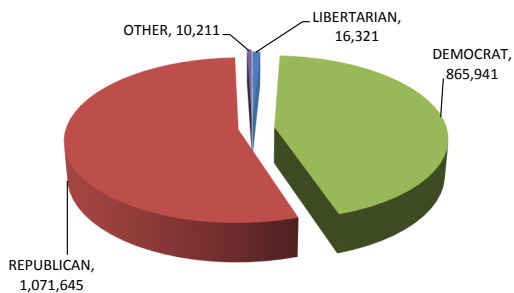

South Carolina State Legislative Landscape:

- ◆ Former U.S. Energy Secretary Bill Richardson wants the Obama administration to keep alive a South Carolina project to turn weapons-grade materials into commercial nuclear reactor fuel.
- ◆ As part of a larger project to convert the coal-burning Asheville plant to natural gas, South Carolina residents told members of the Public Service Commission that they oppose Duke Energy's plans to build a transmission line and substation extending through the northern part of Spartanburg County.
- ◆ Dominion Carolina's plan to run an 8" natural gas pipeline through lower Richland County is drawing protests from citizens.
- ◆ Duke Energy Carolinas is in process of building a 750-megawatt natural gas-fired combined-cycle plant at the existing W.S. Lee Steam Station located in Anderson County, S.C., on the Saluda River. The plant is expected to become operational by the end of 2017.

8 AFV Bills Proposed in 2015 (0 Passed):

Bills of Note included— Combined bill that incorporated CNG and LNG Energy Equivalency, 2000lb Weight Exemption, and a Tax Credit for AFV Vehicles; two bills to impose a user fee of either .5¢ or .7¢ on Motor Fuel; a bill to change motor carrier registration requirements; and a bill to raise motor fuel taxes by .2¢ per year through 2025.
