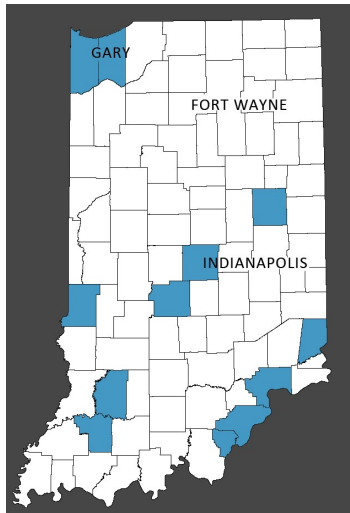

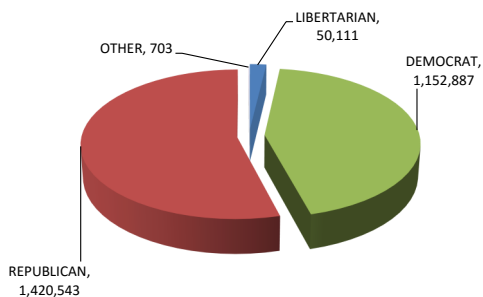

Indiana Legislative Landscape:

- ◆ Local groups filed at block Duke Energy's coal gasification plant in Edwardsport, Indiana.
- ◆ Indiana is still feeling ripples from Senate Bill 340 which shut down the Energizing Indiana program in 2014.
- ◆ An existing coal-fired power plant will be retired in April, 2016 in Martinsville, IN, and a new, state of the art natural gas facility will replace it.
- ◆ The EPA's Clean Power Plan is in the news in Indiana as the Governor of the state was an early front runner in opposing it.

7 AFV Bills Proposed in 2015 (2 passed):

HB-1001 —Amends the Heavy Duty NG Truck tax incentive to make it retroactive for 2013 purchases.

SB-199—Makes corrections to various statutes including the tax credits for alternative fuel vehicles and infrastructure.

5 AFV Bills Passed in 2014:

HB-1448, HB-1104, HB-1108, HB1266, SB-367—Clarified NG sales tax; created a study for alternative transportation funding mechanisms; extended, and made administrative changes to AFV tax credits.
